



Guidelines for MSC Shoot Approval in 2025 / 2026

1. Any Canadian shoot hosted by a club with representation on the MSC committee and following the specific set of guidelines is eligible.
2. All Shoots will be held at a minimum to the rules and safety standards set by the CMSA.
3. Shoot dates and details including location, minimum added money, MSC Point Multiplier, and payout format must be submitted no less than 30 days before the shoot.
4. Payout formats must be clearly advertised. This includes all classes, divisions, and events that will be included in the payout, as well as the set shoot format (3D or Classes) and shall not be subject to change without fair cause and notification to MSC.
5. CMSA Sanctioned shoots by default meet the MSC requirements and approval but MSC still needs to be informed by the host club what the MSC points multiplier and payout structure will be 30 days before the shoot.
6. 3 Stage Minimum for Main Match.
7. 1 Stage Minimum for Rifle and Shotgun.
8. Clubs/Hosts are responsible for posting Stage & Overall results at the competition for viewing as well as on their own websites and/or social media.
9. Clubs are responsible for submitting Overall results in an acceptable format (Excel document) to the MSC. Results to be Emailed to mountedshooterscanada@gmail.com
 - a. A late fee of \$50.00 per day may be charged to the host club if results are not submitted by the Tuesday following the competition.
(Final deadline for submissions is the day before Canadian Finals)
 - b. Results posted to the CMSA Website do not need to be forwarded to the MSC.

10. Complaints and Questions to MSC regarding a shoot's eligibility after the fact will not disqualify the shoot. However, it may be at MSC discretion to modify future approvals for shoots for the host club. Any concerns or questions can be sent to mountedshooterscanada@gmail.com
11. Clubs may only host a 5x MSC Points shoot if they have a minimum of \$5,000.00 added money. Clubs may host 1,2, or 3x MSC point shoots without any minimum added money requirement.
12. Each season, a 4x Points Multiplier "Provincial Championship" may be held in each province.
 - a. The Club with the highest count of total entries in the previous season shall be granted first right of refusal to host their respective "Provincial Championship."
 - b. Entries from Provincial Championships and Canadian Finals will not be counted towards the clubs total entries in the next season.
13. The MSC Point Fee will be included in the main match entry fee, not added on as an additional fee to competitors.
 - a. There is **NO** MSC Fee for Wrangler competitors.
 - b. Canadian Finals Qualifier" status and MSC points **will not be official until all fees have been paid to MSC.**
 - c. The Host club is responsible for submitting any fees owed to the MSC within 14 days of the competition, or the day before Canadian Finals. Whichever comes first. Failure to meet this deadline will result in retroactive removal of points earned at the competition.
14. MSC Point Fee's
 - a. CMSA Shoot
 - 2X MSC Points = \$5
 - 3X MSC Points = \$10
 - 4X MSC Points = \$10
 - 5X MSC Points = \$10
 - b. Non-CMSA Shoot
 - 1X MSC Points = \$5
 - 2X MSC Points = \$10
 - 3X MSC Points = \$15
 - 4X MSC Points = \$15
 - 5X MSC Points = \$15

15. All money raised by collecting these fees will go directly towards the season leader awards. The more you compete, the more you contribute, the better your chances, and the bigger the prize budget. MSC Points & Fees are a collective fundraising effort to raise money towards the Canadian Finals season leader buckles and awards.
16. Season Leader prizes will be awarded based on CMSA Levels going into the Canadian Finals.
17. To qualify for season leader awards, you must have attended at least:

3 MSC approved competitions during the current season, 2 of which must be CMSA sanctioned events.
18. The Canadian Finals Shoot will not be counted as a qualifying shoot, however season points will still be earned at the competition

(Disclaimer) The MSC committee is made up of volunteers across the country, who have competitors' best interests at heart. We understand that on occasion "loopholes" can be found and abused. Concerns of any such activity should be brought to the MSC's attention so that it can be addressed. If warranted, these guidelines may be updated by the MSC.
